Casey Koehn That the business would comply with all city ordinances especially the noise ordinance.

Jeff Hall What do the neighbors think of this that back up to the property?

Mitch Oakes Thinks that this is a great opportunity for the city.

Doris Fuller Likes the idea and would add to the community.

Mike Irick Great way to improve the property and bring tourism to the community. Good way to honor Agricultural in Butler.

Jeff Hall Would the permit be transferable if the property sold?

Casey Koehn No if the property sold the new owner would have to apply for a permit.

David Brown Would the permit only for produce to be grown?

Casey Koehn Yes that only produce can be grown.
